duct its various functions, and hopefully have the opportunity to reintroduce opportunities we currently cannot - such as school events, and so much more.



### FUNDRAISING FOR UKRAINE

As part of our Outreach program, our school began our fundraising efforts to help the people of Ukraine struggling with war, displacement and hardships with 'Toonies for Ukraine'. The goal of this first fundraiser was \$500.00 and we surpassed this goal with just doing a monetary collection from the generous families of Christ the King School. At the time we did not know just how personal our contributions were to get.



Our second fundraiser, the sale of Slime, and yet another success thanks to the generosity of our incredible Christ The King community. When we set out to do this fundraiser, the Grade 3's initially wanted to raise \$200. Little did they know within the first couple of days that they would break that goal! From there, they set out to double their goal of \$400, and within the week and a half of selling, the Grade 3 class was able to raise more than \$460.00.

Our class gives a big thank you to Mrs. McTaggart for all her hard work helping with the slime. As well as a

big thank you to Student Council for giving up their lunch time to sell both upstairs in the Library and downstairs by the office. Most of all, the biggest thank you is to the students and their families for supporting the cause. With all those proceeds, we have been able to buy many household items for two families that have fled Ukraine due to the current war and have moved to Winnipeg. Because of your donations, we have begun to make their new home a little more comfortable.





A third fundraiser was held in May. The Kindergarten and grade 4 class made butterflies and bookmarks and Mr. Bob Stroh painted rocks which were all sold at lunchtime. We made over \$500.00 in sales.

Our last fundraiser was the Gently Used Uniform Sale. Proceeds of \$970.00 were made.

Our original hope from all these fundraisers was to raise \$2000. We reached this goal and surpassed it raising an official grand total of \$2219.62 Thank you so much for your generosity.



### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION NEWS**



Our grades 4-8 Track and Field teams overall did very well at the Manitoba Catholic Schools Athletic Association and Knights of Columbus Track and Field Meets held at the University of Manitoba on June 6<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. After a three year hiatus from

this event for all Catholic Schools due to the pandemic, it was very refreshing to see students from all of the schools competing in the various events.

The June 16<sup>th</sup> event ended very well for our school as the last event, the 4 by 100 relay, saw both of our grade 4 teams get the bronze medallions. Congratulations to our medal winners, as well as those who came ever so close to getting to the podium. Many of our students reached the top eight in their event at both meets, which is important in that top eight receives points towards the school standings. Even if you didn't make the top eight, just by competing you are a track athlete.

Our grade 7 and 8 Royals soccer team played very well at our league tournament in early June, making it all the way to the A-side semi-finals, where they met their match in being defeated by a very tough St. Emile Huskie team by a score of 3-0. To get to the A-side semi's, they tied St. John Brebeuf 3-3 after being down 2-0, and got their scoring together in game two, defeating the Holy Cross Saints 8-3, to



finish in first place in their pool. Thank you goes out to Ms. Rodrigues for coaching the boys.

Our grade 7 and 8 Royals boys also competed in MCSAA

league basketball for the first time in two years (the pandemic stopped our season mid-way in March 2020), where they finished the shortened regular season with a 3 win 3 loss record. This put them in the Tier 2 playoff bracket, and they quickly disposed of St. Emile in their quarter-final game. A bad first quarter in the semi-finals proved costly, as our boys

had to play catch-up for most of the game, and lost to the St. Ignatius Wolverines 49-46 at St. Paul's. St. Ignatius scored the winning basket with 39 seconds left. A very tough defeat to swallow indeed.



The loss put them in the Tier 2 third place game, where they easily defeated Our Lady of Victory Thunder 61-42 (another trophy for our trophy case).



Thank you goes to my assistants Ini (Imisi's brother) and Hayden (William's brother). Thank you also goes out to Mr. Rolfe who coached the grade 6 and 7 developmental boys, who improved by leaps and bounds after each game played.

It was indeed a successful Royals season as we reflect. The Competitive 7 and 8 boys were crowned Tier One Volleyball Champions back in December, which was reported in a previous newsletter.

The success of the Royals program cannot happen without the help of our parent/adult volunteers coaching or helping coach our student athletes. Our first league sport in the new school year will be volleyball, with the grade 6 and 7's playing in the developmental league, and grade 7 and 8's playing in the

competitive league. Other league sports are basketball, badminton, soccer and track and field.

Thank you to all those parents who drove their child to away games this year, and of course for picking them up at our home games. It was different this year as fans were not allowed to watch games as spectators, until restrictions were lifted for that in mid-February for most schools. Thank you all for your patience and understanding.

When purchasing indoor and outdoor running shoes for your child over the summer, proper sizing is much more important than style or color. Please have your child sized with the proper shoes for their feet. Running shoes should have good ankle support and arch support as well. Laces are preferred as they can be tightened and tied up according to comfort level. Velcro is fine for the younger students as long as the Velcro is of good quality.

One huge homework assignment over the summer for all of our Christ the King students: First to get lots of rest. Then you all need to stay active, so you can be fit and healthy for September.


