

Pandia, the Panda destroyed the garage. She coloured on the walls, she spilled all the oil out and burst all the tires.


Carla and Pillow worked together to put food like tomatoes, bamboo and leaves into Carla's trunk.






On June 27th, 2024 we wished farewell to our Grade 8 students. The day began with our school mass at 10am, followed by awards and a luncheon in the gym.
